Thursday Evening at around 8:00 pm, Randy Bird passed away. He was our state owner for the state of Washington. Randy grew up in Rexburg and attended school with John and Cody. He got involved in our business and moved to Wenatchee, Washington around 25 years ago. His wife wrote the following:

Hello to many family and friends,

Though difficult to write, I wanted to let you know that my love of almost 34 years, Randy, passed away yesterday evening after battling a difficult cancer for 2 1/2 years.

For those of you whom we haven't been in touch with, I will give an update.

Randy was diagnosed with Stage 4 Bile Duct Cancer (tumors in liver and lymph nodes) a little over 2 years ago. A rare cancer of which there is no known cause or treatment.

He has long outlived what was expected and did very well throughout most of the journey.

During this time we were able to have many wonderful blessings and even some adventures! We welcomed into our family 4 more granddaughters, 3 more grandsons...and have yet another grandson on the way in September! That will make an even dozen when that little guy arrives!

We will then have 7 granddaughters & 5 grandsons! We also had 2 weddings to cheer us all - Nicole & Alex and Mitchell & Madison! Such blessings in the midst of trial. We also took a wonderful trip to Hawaii with many close friends, took grandchildren to Disneyworld and attended College Graduation for Matthew & Michelle and Michelle's husband, Scot.

We spent time in Arizona with family, and have had constant children and grandchildren here with us through much of this time. Our families, though not close by, have been such an anchor of support for us and we have felt their love buoy us up through difficult days. We were also blessed to be supported by an amazing group of close friends. They are so cherished and walked this long walk with us through thick and thin, ever hoping with us and never tiring to support, love and serve us. Family and friends are the riches of this earth.

We also had incredibly compassionate & skilled Oncologists and nurses over the past few years. They will never be forgotten by us. They are very special people to whom we love and respect greatly. They helped prolong his life, yet this past summer, things took a bit of a turn. Randy started having constant, extreme pain, which he had not experienced up to that point. This was our turning point and a long difficult journey was ahead. He went through many medical procedures which have been tiring and difficult. She has battled short term memory loss but is showing great signs of recovery these past few months and I am ever grateful to a loving Heavenly Father for preserving her life. These two trials together some days seemed unbearable, as we waited and wondered what the outcomes would be.

However, many prayers from so many helped strengthen us to bear our trials and go forward with faith and gratitude in our hearts. It was humbling to hear of prayers being offered for us literally all over the world. They sustained us in ways we cannot describe. There is great power in prayer. The service we have received has also been appreciated. So many, many small & large acts of kindness, each equally important & cherished. We cannot begin to repay or thank you enough.

We have been buoyed up by many angels. Especially so the past few months, both seen and unseen. We have witnessed many miracles and God's hand in our life every day in such personal ways. Thanks once again for all you have done for Randy, myself and my family. It has been inspiring and humbling. We are all ever grateful.
