I was talking to Rodney Trent, an operator Indiana, and he told me that when he first started his large competitor would wave at him in passing. Now he said his competitor won't wave or look at him. Rodney said he must be number 1 now in town because his competitor always holds up one finger to say hi. Why? Rodney has become the best in his town.

The third thing is how you dress. It is one of the most important things you can do. He said look like a marine in dress blues. Sometime looking good outweighs how comfortable we are.

Being the best in the industry takes a lot of effort and dedication. If we work at it a little at a time we can achieve greatness. Let's team up together to be the best we can be.
